Downtown Gets Smarter

The Town has partnered with Vivacity DC, Inc. to provide smart city technology to downtown Herndon. As part of a two year pilot program, some downtown street lights has been replaced with remotely controlled LED luminaires and "smart poles". This project will also include installation of an electric vehicle charging station on a public parking lot and a public Wi-Fi network downtown. The "smart poles" will include cameras and counters to monitor bicycle and pedestrian flow on the W&OD, blue button emergency features, and Internet of Things sensors for other smart city services.

Downtown Redevelopment

The Town's project with Comstock Companies, Inc. to develop 4.675 acres in downtown with three mixed-use building comprising of retail (17,600SF), an Arts Center, (18,000SF), 273 apartments, and a 787 space parking garage has an approved HPRB Certificate of

Appropriateness and approved site plan. The developer has been working diligently with the Town to close on the property and begin construction. As proposed, this development would provide numerous amenities downtown for the public including an outdoor splash pad, numerous bicycle parking facilities, and an Arts Walk with permanent and temporary exhibits.

Upcoming District Changes

In addition to the Preservation Program Update that will include new architectural surveys, new design guidelines, and a resource guide for District property owners, there are several upcoming Town initiatives affecting the District. A public wayfinding sign program town-wide with specific District identifying signage is planned to be launched in 2020. Also in 2020, the Town will begin construction on an intersection improvements project at Center and Elden Streets with a Monroe and Elden Street intersection improvements project to follow shortly thereafter.
